A Review: The Third EMI Training Program

EMI, which stands for English as the Medium of nstruction, is a training program provided by ITS to equip ITS lecturers to teach courses in English. EMI training is part of Academic Teaching Excellence (ATE) courses run by the British Council worldwide. It is originally co-developed by the British Council and the University of Oxford.

During the past three years, 10 batches of EMI training have been successfully run at ITS. The training is a form of collaboration between ITS and the British Council. This program is a manifestation of the academic regulation that in each semester of at least two courses are offered in English for each undergraduate and postgraduate

The existence of the international classes creates an ambient of internationalization in the campus as well as invites significant number of international students. Accepting international students opens wide an opportunity for ITS students to interact with students from different countries thus enhancing their cross cultural understanding in addition to their knowledge and hard competencies. Ultimately the achievement of internationalization of ITS is also increasing.

Mr. Andrew Hunt as the British Council trainer has expressed his remarkable impression toward the trainees. He says, "it has been such a pleasure to see so many ITS skilled lecturers sharing their talents and passion as they learn new techniques for teaching their subjects in English. All of them are forward-thinking, talented and passionate educators, as a British Council trainer, it is an honour to work at such an inspiring university.'

Up to January 2017, a total of 186 trainees from ITS have gained full confidence in teaching by using English after the EMI training. EMI is not a class to learn English, but the skill of teaching, how to make the classroom a student center learning instead of

The positive response of the EMI training increased and the trainees stated that the knowledge that was obtained can be applied also in the Indonesian-classroom, because basically EMI is not a class to learn English, but the skill of teaching, how to make the classroom a student learning center instead of passive class. Up to January 2017, a total of 95 trainees from ITS have gained full confidence in teaching by using English after the EMI training.



Proudly presents A New Directorate of Innovation at ITS

At national scale, researchers at state universities are expected to contribute in making or creating technology to solve industrial and community's problems in Indonesia. Under the direction of Directorate of Higher Education through the development of national research strategy, encouraging researcher's initiatives in innovation are essential to upgrade the level of technology readiness. Researchers are encouraged to create products that are ready to be applied.

In correlation with the above-mentioned matter, funding, infrastructure, and other related points become essential. As an autonomous university, ITS has flexibility in mobilizing resources and harnessing the power of itself autonomously, either science techno-park, incubators, and Management Board and Business Development (BPPU).

In 2016, ITS established a new directorate namely Directorate of Innovation. The tasks of the directorate are to provide an environment or arena for innovators to keep growing and to nurture and to channel innovated technology or products to reach the stakeholders.

The first target is to record, preserve, and collect research and innovation data as well as to map the potential opportunity of innovation at ITS. In the near future, the innovation profiles will be published by the Directorate innovation in a form of book and brochure as well as a database application based on smartphone technology. By providing such a system, interested users can easily and quickly

The next target is to introduce teaching industry scheme. In this case, innovation is derived through a long-time research activity, which consists of lecturers and students as the researchers. Innovation created by this syneray can be taken forward into entrepreneurship. It is expected that the alumni who have owned their own business or held a strategic position in companies can look at ITS as a potential partner in developing innovation to support their business line.

The program has been conducted since 2012 where some selected students are given a chance to experience a comparative study in internationallyrecognized universities, institution, and industries which allowed them in experiencing the atmosphere across different countries or cultures. There must be a valuable taught by seeing different things wisely.

Singapore is a dynamic, multiracial and multicultural society whereas the citizens maintain traditions handed down through generations while comfortably adopting the conveniences of modern life and technology. In correlation to above-mentioned definition, this year's agenda was started from 6 to 9 February 2017 by visiting several insightful places, such as; Nanyang Technological University, PUB Singapore's National Water Agency, LASALLE College of the Arts and Care Community Services Society. Those options are designed by the committee to sharpen the knowledge about getting into the internationalization and learn how it works.

The ITS delegation was led by Dr. Maria Anityasari and totally there are 22 students who dispatched on this program. Most of them are the volunteers who served in the Directorate of International Relations.

ITS signed the MoU with The Ministry of Planning and Strategic Investment (MPIE) Timor-Leste

In order to take part in reinforcing and strengthening neighborhood institution, ITS signed a MoU with The Ministry of Planning and Strategic Investment (MPIE) Timor-Leste on 11th April 2016. The signees are Prof. Joni Hermana, Rector of ITS and Mr. Ismenio Martins da Silva, Secretary of Human Capital Development Fund (HCDF) - MPIE.



The gareement valid for 2016-2020 and covers activities of sending the young talented student to ITS for undergraduate and graduate programs, laboratory internship in ITS and sending ITS lecturers and laboratory staffs to Timor-Leste, and other possible academic and scientific activities.

On 15th Des 2016, a related MoA was further signed by Prof. Ketut Buda Artama, Vice Rector for Research, Innovation and Partnership of ITS, and Mr. Ismenio Martins da Silva to realize one program: Timor-Leste supports the scholarship for their 39 young-selected students studying at ITS for undergraduate program (S1) 2017-2021. They will be equally distributed to 13 departments of Mathematics, Mechanical Engineering, Industrial Engineering, Material & Metallurgical Engineering, Biomedical Engineering, Environmental Engineering, Geophysical Engineering, Industrial Product Design, Interior Design, Naval Architecture and Ship Building Engineering, Marine Engineering, Ocean Engineering and Marine Transportation.

Student selection is organized and run by the Directorate of Academic and Directorate of International Office on February 2017 in Timor-Leste. The selection is arranged based on 2 stepwise screening; first, is written test of basic science and potential academic, and second is direct interview for only the 1st test-passed persons. In March-June 2017, the selected students will attend the matriculation program by providing an appropriate basic science level at ITS under a selected agency.

The matriculation program covers subjects of basic physics, calculus, Bahasa Indonesia and English. In August 2017, they are ready to enroll their selves to study at their chosen departments. To support and achieve their success, their academic performances are monitored and supported by additional mentoring under the coordination of Department, Directorate of Academic, and Directorate of International Office.

Australia Indonesia Center - Urban Water Cluster

Australia – Indonesia Centre (AIC) has been established in 2014 as a joint initiative of the Australian and Indonesian governments. The Centre is a consortium of eleven highly respected research institutionsfrom Australia and Indonesia. At Australia side, there are Australian National University, Monash University, University of Melbourne, and University of Sydney; while at Indonesia side, the partners are Institut Pertanian Bogor, Institut Teknologi Bandung, Institut Teknologi Sepuluh Nopember (ITS), Universitas Airlangga, Universitas Hasanuddin, Universitas Gadjah Mada, and Universitas Indonesia. This initiative issupported by the Department of Research, Technology and Higher Education (RISTEK-DIKTI).

There are five research clusters under the Centre. One of them is Urban Water Cluster which has been conducted in Surabaya dan Bogor (Greater Jakarta) since August 2016and planned to be completed in 2019. The objective of the research is to seek opportunity to leapfrog certain stages in creating urban water sensitive city. Lecturers, researchers, and students from many departments at ITS, led by Dr. Maria Anityasari, are involved in this cluster, from Environmental Engineering, Industrial Engineering, Civil Engineering, Architecture Department, and Urban and Regional Planning Department. The researchers are working on six related sub-projects namely i) Benchmarking tools to create benchmarking tool applied for Surabaya,ii) Socio-institutional pathway to develop governance models enable for leapfrogging, iii) Infrastructure adaptation pathways to create simulation model of water sensitive city, iv) Green technology pathways which will work on stormwater/greywater biofilters for urban farming, v) Urban design and demostration to test how water sensitive built environment can be developed, and vi) Learning alliances between researchers, government and industry. The results of this cooperation will be exhibited in the CommTECH Highlight 2017.

This course covers some important aspects of leapfrogging in developing city towards water sensitive city from idea generation, brainstorming, observation, visitation and project planning. Participants also have a chance to visit community and government agencies to get better understanding about the water-related problems. Participants will be exposed to real water related project and expected to solve to solve the problems using science and technology through a multi-diciplinary approach. This course is part of a research under Australia-Indonesia Centre.

Subcourse B: **Smart City**

This course introduces participants to the concept of smart city and how Surabaya evolves towards a smart city. 
