Opening Ceremony

The Guest-of-Honour and Keynote Speakers will share inspiring stories from their rich experiences with the students, allowing them to better understand the social issues that are happening on a deeper level.



Dragonboat

Dragon boating requires coordination and collaboration, teaching participants the importance of teamwork and the spirit of perseverance – characteristics of a true leader.



The Leadership Challenge (TLC)

Games at TLC are designed to bring out the leadership qualities in delegates by training them to be constantly on the lookout for leading opportunities and step up to the task.



Dialogue with Time Tour

Guided by senior guides, students will experience what it is like as an aged individual, and understand what it means to build an inclusive society.



Social Enterprise Visit

Visit one of the social enterprises in Singapore to understand the actual running of a company, challenges they face, as well as the social impact they can create.



Enabling Village Tour

Take a tour of Singapore's first fully integrated community space catered for everybody regardless of physical ability, and see various social enterprises driven by Persons with Disabilities.



Group Discussion

Students will be led by trained facilitators to discuss about the world's pressing social issues, kickstarting their journeys for the final project.



Social Enterprise Workshop

What makes a dream team? Delegates will identify their strengths and discover their best-suited roles in a team, allowing them to understand what it means to be an effective leader.



Project Fine-tuning and Competition

Under the guidance of experienced mentors, participants would generate sustainable ideas to solve social issues, then present them in front of a panel of mentor-turned judges.
