

Institut Teknologi Sepuluh Nopember (ITS) welcomed a virtual visit from the Consulate General of Japan in Surabaya on Wednesday (7/7). The visit was attended by the newly elected Japanese Consulate General, Mr. Takeyama Kenichi and his staff. From ITS, the visit was attended by ITS Rector, Prof. Dr. Ir. Mochamad Ashari M.Eng., along with other members of ITS Executive Board and staff.



Through this visit, Mr. Takeyama intended to strengthen cooperation with ITS and to develop more projects with ITS and Indonesia. Prof. Ashari, in his remarks, stated that ITS partnerships with Japan, especially with some of the best universities in Japan, have been going very well for a long time. Considering the major development of Japanese technology and innovation, Prof. Ashari wished to initiate more collaborations with Japan because it is about time that universities become educational centers and enhance entrepreneurship activities. Regarding the opportunities, ITS Vice-Rector for Research, Innovation, Cooperation, and Alumni, Bambang Pramujati, Ph.D. explained that ITS has 10 productive research centers and expected to cooperate further with universities in Japan. Two parties hoped that this meeting would mark the new chapter of relations between ITS and Japan.







ITS Collaborates with Nokia and Indosat Oredoo to Build 5G Experience Center

Institut Teknologi Sepuluh Nopember (ITS) has always been committed to keeping up with the latest technology. Therefore, ITS is building a 5G Experience Center in the campus. In a virtual meeting held on Friday (2/7), ITS Rector, Prof. Dr. Ir. Mochamad Ashari M.Eng., explained that this is a collaboration project with NOKIA and Indosat Ooredoo, a major telecommunication company in Indonesia.

Through this project, ITS will not only build a 5G Experience Center at ITS that provides ITS students a new learning technology, but also will start a 5G implementation program in Surabaya through the Shining Surabaya program. This program aims to implement the access of 5G in Surabaya, starting from ITS Campus, Indosat Ooredoo Gallery, City Hall, Consulate General Office of Finland in Surabaya, to shopping centers and airports. So far, some devices, especially radios (mmWave 5G, FSMF, FXED & AirScale), Core, and Transport devices, have been installed in the ITS Center of Knowledge. Prof. Ashari hopes that this project will run smoothly and benefit all Surabaya citizens.

The existence of a healthy and livable environment has been a challenge for world citizens nowadays. Therefore, ITS students designed an eco-friendly electric car called i-Deora. The students are the member of SACH-MOLINA ITS team, consists of Muhammad Haekal Shafi, lan Reyhan Junior, Fahreza Aji Taruna, Fikriyubi Fertomo, Rhema Agi Magiza, Muhammad Rumi Latif, Fahri Humaidi, Tengku Rafly Rizqulloh, Riqy Rizqyandra, and Athaariq Ardhiansyah.

The leader of the team, Muhammad Haekal explained that Shafi. the development of i-Deora has been prioritizing not only the engine system, but also the exterior and interior design itself, so that the car can become an everyday urban vehicle.

Moreover, i-Deora was designed using V-shape diagram rules. stage is the review phase of the existing literature, market needs, and potential ideas. After the first stage, the team continued with planning research on design, models, and engine specifications. This innovation recently won 2nd place in the Car Design category at the 2021 PLN Innovation & Competition in Electricity (ICE) event. Furthermore, i-Deora is expected to be produced for commercial purposes.
