Living in my own country versus studying abroad, in my opinion, **is really different**. I may push myself by relocating far from my nation of origin. I could gain knowledge of the various cultures, traditions, and customs found in the area where I currently reside. I would interact with a wide variety of individuals from other nations. In addition, one of my aspirations is to become a qualified human resource to **help my country prosper**.

When I first arrived at ITS and Surabaya, there were plenty of **impressive moments**. The ITS campus provided the first impression. The vast site is completely covered in **greenery**, including gardens and woodlands. It felt like I had encountered a different circumstance in my lifetime owing to the building's fascinating structure. My second impression of Surabaya came about when traveling from the airport to the campus. I was pleased to observe that the road was lined with big plants and gardens, as I tend to favor the atmosphere of the outdoors over that of the city. Although it is slightly hotter here than in Cambodia, I have never experienced issues with the weather.

The most difficult obstacle I encountered at ITS was **language**. Sometimes, lectures with explanations are provided in Indonesian. **The issue was easily resolved.** I made an effort to speak in English with all of my classmates and lecturers, and I regularly requested to translate the questions and explanations during class into English. **I also tried to learn Indonesian with the guidance of the international office staff and executed some self-study.**

My favorite ITS experience has been virtually all of it since the lecturers are so welcoming and helpful. I occasionally schedule a meeting with them to request assistance with some of the courses and tasks that I find challenging. **With a smile and a welcoming invitation to ask, they are always delighted to help.** Additionally, there are views of the campus's large, greenery, friendly students, and so on.

I would suggest choosing ITS for your educational program for an international student. They must get ready for specific prerequisites according to the sort of scholarship if they decide to go with ITS. I strongly encourage them to get ready to encounter many various challenges, including those related to eating habits, culture, the weather, and other factors.

I would like to share about my experiences while I was an ITS student. Connecting new people here and from around the world has **greatly pushed me to challenge myself.** I appreciate the way education is regulated here because I have acquired some new technologies in my field of study. I have traveled to many different areas, all of which are wonderful and great for exploring the natural world. **I firmly advise all international students to make decisions about ITS for their educational experience and Indonesia for their tourism.**
