# RESEARCH GRANT BANK INDONESIA

Research Grant is a funding scheme of Bank Indonesia allocated for strategic research, frontier research, and model development research conducted by external researchers

# **OBJECTIVE**

- Obtaining research results in the form of developing new paradigms and/ or strengthening and confirming the existing paradigms, associated with the economic policy structures and framework that can enrich research results in support of policy formulation by Bank Indonesia
- 2. Enhance the credibility of Bank Indonesia's policies apart from internal reviews as well as through high-quality strategic research from external parties.
- 3. Expanding the research network while encouraging the increased participation of expert researchers (experienced / professional PhD) in conducting research relevant to the scope of Bank Indonesia.

## **BASIC PRINCIPLES**

Bank Indonesia as the organizer of Research Grant is the highest institution in monetary policy making and stability of Indonesia's financial system. Realizing the magnitude of these roles and mandates, all of its policies must be based on highquality research to achieve national development goals. Therefore, through the Bank Indonesia all forms of activities Institute in implementation of the program must uphold the strategic values of BI and integrity pact of research activities, performance based and in line with best practice, and governance quality.

# CHAPTER 3 RESEARCH GRANT SCHEME

- Research Grant Competition Scheme (Open for Public)
  - Offered openly through online media and print media
  - Addressed to Institutions where 1 (one) institution may send / endorse more than 1 (one) proposal
  - Not restricted to institutions that have an MoU with BI

- Research Grant Invitation Scheme (Limited)
  - Offered only to specific research groups that possess the competence according to the research topic
  - Addressed to Institutions where 1 (one) institution may send / endorse more than 1 (one) proposal
  - Preferably to institutions that already have an MoU with BI
  - Invitations can be given to individual researchers with excellent expertise and reputations

# CHAPTER 4 QUALIFICATION OF RESEARCH GRANT RECIPIENTS AND GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

# Qualification of the Research Grant Recipients are as follows:

- 1) The research grant recipient is representing a reputable institution;
- 2) Hold a PhD (Lead) and/or professional experience specifically related to the research grant theme;
- 3) Have a previously written work related to the chosen topic;
- Excellent reputation in academic / professional as evidenced by track record of research/professional experiences (minimum of 3 years);
- 5) Having previously published an article in international journal Tier 1 (Q1-Q4) and/or minimum Tier 2 (BMEB, JIMF, JBER, IJIF, and/or journals listed in leading publishers; Emerald, Springer, Elsevier, and JSTOR). Applicants who come from professional background must have at least published a popular article and/or presented his/her work in a national/international forum.

# General Requirements of Research Grant are listed below:

- Research Grant Bank Indonesia consists of Frontier Research and Model Development. Research theme must provide contributions to: Maintaining Stability, Strengthening Growth Momentum Amidst High Uncertainties, with reference to 3 main pillars: Strengthening Policy Mix, Accelerating Structural Reform and Navigating Digital Economy;
- 2) Strenghtening Policy, Accelerating Structural Reformation and Navigating Digital Economy;
- 3) Research has clarity of completion time;
- 4) The researcher must include in his/her paper that the study is supported by Research Grant Bank Indonesia;
- 5) The Research Grant output consists of Report of Research Results, and/or Working Paper (WP), Occasional Paper (OP). Subsequently the WP and OP must be published in an indexed-journal.

# CHAPTER 8 **COPYRIGHT OF RESEARCH RFSUITS**


- The intellectual property of the research result is owned by Researcher and BI or as agreed

- Publication in accordance with the standards of feasibility of research results, either in the form of Working Paper (WP) / Occasional Paper (OP) and works to be published in international journals
- The results of such research can be used as reference and for the interest of BI

# CHAPTER 11 OTHERS: EXECUTION OF RESEARCH GRANT BI

Based on the results of discussions with officials of the Department of Strategic Procurement (DPS) and Legal Department (DHK), to be recommended the implementation of Research Grant Bank Indonesia as PDG Number 18/9/PDG/2016 dated June 30, 2016 and SE Number 18/69/INTERN dated June 30, 2016 concerning the Management of Logistics of Bank Indonesia Article 51 Chapter Nine Implementation of Procurement with Self-management (1) Work Criteria that can be conducted by Self-management in Chapter (a), (f) and (g), with the following considerations:

- a. The involvement of research experts to conduct the research.
- b. The researcher criteria are leading non-profit institutions, which includes universities, foundations, Non-Governmental Organization (NGO), etc.

If the necessary infrastructures are deemed sufficient, we plan to conduct research grants with competition scheme (open for public), to provide an even wider opportunity to researchers / national and international research organisations.

Departments outside of BINS that are willing to conduct research grant activity must report to BINS and use the guidance issued by Bank Indonesia Institute.

## THINGS WHICH HAVE BEEN

- 1. Analytical studies based on national and international benchmarking results have been conducted. The findings can be used as a frame of reference for similar research activities. The benchmark includes other central banks (BNM, Bank of Canada), national research institutions (DIKTI, DIPI-Dana Ilmu Pengetahuan Indonesia), international research organization) NBER-National Beureau of Economic Research), international organization such as World Bank (WB), and internal research department of Bank Indonesia (DKMP, DKEM, and DRK).
- 2. Submission of Memorandume Number 20/41/BINS/M.02/B dated 13 March 2018 addressed to Mr. Perry Warjiyo, ADG Field 3 concerning the results of the preliminary study and concept of Research Grant Bank Indonesia Handbook.
- 3. Discussion with ADG Field 3 dated 2 April 2018, specifically related to:
  - a) Exploration of analysis on the quality of research findings/outcomes relevant to strategic research of BI which are suitable for publishing in international journal;
  - b) Research Grant Bank Indonesia fund components that are able to meet Bank Indonesia's expectations based on research applicability, policy-regulatory benefit, economic benefit, and scientific benefit.
  - c) Preparation of the 2018 RG timeline which has 3 (three) stages, including: preparation and selection stage, implementation and finalization stage, and reporting and evaluation stage.

#### ARTICLE 10

#### **DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

- (1) If in the execution of this agreement there arise any disagreements or disputes, both parties agree to settle it by deliberation for consensus.
- (2) If the settlement referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article is not reached, both parties agree to submit the settlement of the dispute through the District Court and both parties choose permanent residence / domicile in the Registrar of the Central Jakarta District Court.

#### ARTICLE 11

#### SANCTION AND TERMINATION OF THE AGREEMENT

- (1) Under any circumstances, the SECOND PARTY is solely responsible for finishing the reports referred to in Article 3 of this agreement.
- (2) If from the date of submission of the final report as referred to in Article 5 paragraph (1) of this agreement the report has not been received by the FIRST PARTY, then SECOND PARTY shall pay the damages of 1/1000 (one thousandth) of the contract value for each day of delay with a maximum amount of 5% (five percent) of the cost of performing the work.
- (3) If the SECOND PARTY unable to complete the work, even if the amount of indemnity as referred to in paragraph (2) of this Article has reached 5% (five percent) of the contract value, the FIRST PARTY shall give written notice to SECOND PARTY 3 times consecutively with a grace period of 7 days each from the sending of the letter.
- (4) If after the written warning as referred to in paragraph (3) of this Article the SECOND PARTY still has not fulfilled its obligations, then the FIRST PARTY entitles unilaterally to terminate this agreement. All losses suffered by FIRST PARTY both material and financial arising as a result of termination of this agreement, fully the responsibility of SECOND PARTY.
- (1) If after the termination of the agreement as referred to in Paragraph (4) of this Article, the SECOND PARTY:
  - a. Must not accept the remaining payment
  - b. Is obliged to submit all results of research and analysis as intended in Article 4 Paragraph (4) of this agreement, no later than 15 (fifteen) days after the termination of this agreement
- (6) The provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Article shall not apply if the non-fulfilment of the SECOND PARTY obligations as a consequence of force majeure.



- (7) If the SECOND PARTY notifies the FIRST PARTY in writing of the likelihood of delay in the execution of duties before such condition occurs and is approved by the FIRST PARTY, the provisions of paragraph 2 of this article shall not apply.
- (8) Any additional costs incurred as a result of the delay in execution as referred to in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Article shall be entirely in the SECOND PARTY's expenses.

#### ARTICLE 12

#### **FORCE MAJEURE**

- (1) The force majeure in this Agreement are those unforeseeable circumstances that prevent and restrict the implementation of this agreement, and take place beyond the power and ability of the SECOND PARTY to overcome and be approved by the FIRST PARTY ie natural disasters, strikes, disease outbreaks, rebellion, war, working hours shortened by the government, fire, and or the Regulation of the Government concerning the state of danger as well as other matters equivalent to it, fail the SECOND PARTY to fulfill its obligations or terminate his work.
- (2) The events referred to in paragraph (1) of this article shall be justified by the local authorities and notified in writing by the SECOND PARTY to the FIRST PARTY no later than 14 (fourteen) days after the occurrence of the event for approval by the FIRST PARTY. In the condition where 50 (fifty) days has passed since the day of notification and no decision has been made by the FIRST PARTY, then the event is deemed to have been approved.
- (3) Under conditions of force majeure, the SECOND PARTY's obligations may be amended based on the mutual agreement of the parties in writing in the form of an addendum.

#### **ARTICLE 13**

#### OTHER RELATED MATTERS

- (1) In the event where the research output is not in accordance with the research objective, the FIRST PARTY thereby has the power to determine the output of Research Grant Bank Indonesia as "disclaimer".


